Unit Description

'Lettering is the art of drawing letters; Calligraphy is the art of writing letters; Typography is the art of using letters.' Definitions by @ianbarnard

In this elective unit you will have the opportunity to research and explore hand drawn and digitally produced lettering and calligraphy techniques, with a view to embellishing illustrative work or developing word as image. (Originate Principle) You will understand how letterforms can be used to add to communication techniques and latent meaning in words. (Advocate Principle) You will also explore how this skill is utilised in other industries, Fashion, Architecture, Advertising for example.(Collaborate Principle) This will be a practical based unit involving a series of workshops and projects, with a view to adding to the portfolio and enhancing to your skill base for future units. (Cultivate Principle)

Unit Indicative Content

- Workshops experimenting with calligraphic techniques
- Use of a range of both digital and print based media.
- Hand-drawn lettering /sign writing workshops

- Reflection and evaluation using a sketchbook.
- Type and image experimentation
- Exploration of moving/animated letterforms

Unit Aims

- To develop confident hand drawn lettering techniques
- To explore the digital production of hand drawn letterforms (ipad)
- To explore calligraphic techniques and their role in illustrative responses
- To explore the relationship between word and image
- To develop techniques for moving letterforms for narrative
