Research

Design an A5 flyer to invite people to come and live in your Utopia!

Your flyer needs to include a Title (Decide on the name of your Utopia), Top 5 Key features of your Utopia.

Lastly it needs to have a drawing/imagery of your Utopia, refer back to your earlier research!

Step 2—Imagery: Drawing

Decide on how you want to show what your Utopia looks like, Here are two drawing tutorials to help you sketch a base that you can develop in your Utopia.

Step 3—Key features

This where you list 5 things we can't see or do not immediately notice from your drawing. It could be the great education system, or health care protocols or maybe that there is no currency just exchange of services. List your features then pick the Top % and include why it's so great!

Step 4—Title and tagline

Now that you can visually see your utopia and have the key features, now is time to decide on the name, it can be anything you like. It can be as simple as your name plus "Opia" Eg: Tori-opia.

Now the tagline: The most successful taglines are only 3-6 words long and get the point across without much thought. Ideally, your tagline should be six words or fewer. Points to remember when creating your tagline:

- 1. Keep it simple
- 2. Give it meaning
- 3. Clarity is key
- 4. Focus on the benefits
- 5. Try out some power words
- 6. Look at other examples

Here are some examples of great taglines:

Nike: Just Do It!

Apple: Think Different

L'Oreal: Because You're Worth It

M&Ms: Melts in Your Mouth, Not in Your Hands
